Reflection

The early Christians thought that all their questions about death had been answered with the resurrection of Jesus. Therefore, when loyal Christians began to die, not only did their old questions come back, but also they were plagued with new and difficult ones. Was it possible that those

loyal Christians had not been loyal after all? Or worse, were the promises made by Jesus empty promises? No! Paul assures us. It is all true. Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again, and all the faithful will be joined with him. *How* it will happen, we do not know. *When* it will happen, we do not know. *That* it will happen, we are sure.

The wisdom that we have culled from life becomes the treasury from which we draw the prudence and insight needed to negotiate life's paradoxes. It throws light on our strengths and on our weaknesses; it enables us to discern what is important and what is not; it directs us to bring extra oil in our lamps. Life and the wisdom that we have acquired through it, have taught us that we can indeed trust the promises of God. They have been fulfilled in the past, and wisdom assures us that they will be fulfilled in the future. It is wisdom that cautions us to be vigilant, to be ready to adjust our plans. It is wisdom that prepares us for the night watches of life. It is wisdom that instructs us to be ready at all times.

Reflection

In one sense the parable of the wise and foolish virgins could be considered the first known oil crisis in the east. It is, however, about planning for the future and pacing oneself to see that one has a future to enjoy.

In Christian theology this is called 'discernment'. St Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, wrote a lot about discernment and one of his teachings is that the Holy Spirit allows us to prepare for our future without living it.

Think for a moment of the times when we are going to have a difficult interview or a conversation we would rather not have. We play out in our mind how the interaction will run. It reach, happened how we imagine and we find that our anyiety

interaction will run. It rarely happens how we imagine and we find that our anxiety and fear has often been misplaced. What is curious is that on the next occasion we go through this same process of trying to live the future all over again. Tragically, some people are so anxious about their future that they try and control it, and everyone associated with it. It's always a disaster.

St Ignatius was suspicious of this process. Ignatius seems to have understood today's Gospel very well. The early church thought Jesus would return quickly. There was a crisis of faith when he didn't. Some Christians lived as though this imminent return was a fact. We are still waiting. Matthew tells us then, that the Christian life is about wisdom, right judgment and reading the signs of the times.

St Ignatius tells us the best way to prepare for the future is to let go of the unhealed past, as best as we can, and live in the here and now. The Holy Spirit helps us see what needs to be done today and what preparation is necessary for tomorrow. This is such simple and sound advice and yet many of us don't heed it. For some of us it takes nothing to feel the hurt and pain of our past or to be consumed by the future.

Alcoholics Anonymous sums it up neatly when it tells us to take life 'one day at a time' which is another way of saying what Matthew's community came to see, 'keep awake because you know not the time or place'. Edited extract Fr Richard Leonard

Pope calls for 'paradigm shift' in Catholic theology

Pope Francis has called for a '*paradigm shift'* in Catholic theology that takes widespread engagement with contemporary science, culture and people's lived experience as an essential starting point.

Citing the need to deal with '*profound cultural transformations*,' the Pope presented his dramatic vision for the future of Catholic

theology titled Ad Theologiam Promovendam, or 'to promote theology,' the document revises the statutes of the Pontifical Academy of Theology (PATH) 'to make them more suitable for the mission that our time imposes on theology'.

`Theology can only develop in a culture of dialogue and encounter between different traditions and different knowledge, between different Christian confessions and different religions, openly engaging with everyone, believers and nonbelievers,' the Pope wrote in the apostolic letter.

Pope Francis wrote that Catholic theology must experience a '*courageous cultural revolution*' in order to become a '*fundamentally contextual theology*'. Guided by Christ's incarnation into time and space, this approach to theology must be capable of reading and interpreting '*the Gospel in the conditions in which men and women live daily, in different geographical, social, and cultural environments,*' the Pope wrote.

He contrasted this approach with a theology that is limited to '*abstractly re-proposing formulas and schemes from the past*' and repeated his long-standing criticism of '*desk-bound theology*'. Instead, he emphasised that theological studies must be open to the world, not as a "'*tactical*' attitude" but as a profound '*turning point*' in their method, which he said must be '*inductive*.'

Pope Francis emphasised that this bottom-up re-envisioning of theology is necessary to better aid the Church's evangelising mission.

"A synodal, missionary, and 'outgoing' Church can only correspond to an 'outgoing' theology," the Pope wrote. Edited extract Cathnews
