On **Divine Mercy Sunday**, 7th April, Pope Francis noted that the 'fullness of life' comes not from the pursuit of transitory pleasure but is 'realised in Jesus'.

'To have life,' the Pope said, 'it is enough to fix one's eyes on the crucified and risen Jesus, encountering him in the sacraments and in prayer, recognising that he is present, believing in him, letting oneself be touched by his grace and guided by his example, experiencing the joy of loving like him. Every living encounter with Jesus enables us to have more life.'

Pope Francis presented this message in contrast with today's prevalent narratives of what constitutes a good life and the pursuit of happiness, observing that it is 'a frenetic race to enjoy and possess many things.' Cautioning against this materialistic and myopic view, he stressed that 'by following the path of pleasure and power one does not find happiness'.



`Indeed, many aspects of existence remain unanswered, such as love, the inevitable experiences of pain, of limitations, and of death. And then the dream we all have in common remains unfulfilled,' the Pope continued.

Reflecting on this Gospel passage, Pope Francis draws our attention to the three key verbs: look, touch, and eat.

'To look is not only to see,' the Pope points out, adding that 'it is more; it also involves intention, will.' When Jesus asks the disciples to look at his hands and feet, therefore, he is not only offering visual proof of identity. Rather, Jesus is inviting his disciples to look at his wounded limbs as 'a first step against indifference, against the temptation to look

the other way before the difficulties and sufferings of others.' Jesus' wounds are still present for those with the courage to look at them.

Similarly, Jesus' invitation to the disciples to confirm his presence by touch has a teaching element too. 'By inviting the disciples to touch him,' the Pope suggests, 'Jesus indicates to them and to us that the relationship with him and with our brothers and sisters cannot remain "at a distance".' Having seen the wounds, we must be close to the wounded.

Finally, by eating with his disciples Jesus again did more than prove he was physically present at that specific moment. As the Pope points out, 'eating, when we do so together, among family or friends ... becomes an expression of love, and expression of communion.'

Once again, the Gospel suggests Jesus' action had a deeper meaning about Jesus' continuing presence among his followers. As St Augustine said of the Eucharist, we become what we consume, which means something truly amazing: *The Risen Jesus still eats with us*!

St Bernard's Holy Week Reflection 2024

Palm Sunday

Hans, Sivens, and I arrived at St. Bernard's Parish in Belmont on Palm Vigil Sunday, 2024, to a warm welcome from Fr. Sang Ho. We saw Sang already at work in the parish, decorating the palm tree in the front foyer in preparation for the Mass. He showed us the presbytery, where we would be staying for a week.

Palm Sunday was a Sunday of joy, and the parishioners looked happy with palms in their hands as they processed from the foyer to the church: "Hosanna! Blessed is He who

comes in the name of the Lord!" The King who sat on the colt on Palm Sunday was the same King who was on the Cross of Calvary.



Tenebrae & The Stations of the Cross



Something that I experienced differently at St Bernard's parish was the Tenebrae service and the reflection on Stations of the Cross in a contemporary context.

The contrasting images of the darkness of the world and the light of Christ of Tenebrae reminded me of John's Gospel: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (Jn 8:12)

Contemporary reflections on the Station of the Cross enabled the people of God to reflect on their relationship with Jesus and encouraged everyone to take part in making a better world—a world of justice, peace, consolation, and hope.

Back to the presbytery. Sang was the master chef in the house. He did most of the cooking, and we did the washing up. Hans and Sivens prepared a healthy Indonesian dish that left a lasting impression on Sang. No doubt, the fish menu was the most preferred, and Sang decided to take on the challenge of having fruit for his dessert.

Ghosts, meals and humanity

When Jesus appeared to them, the disciples thought they were seeing a ghost, a sort of projection of a human image on the screen of the world but with no human depth and vitality. In fact, ghosts seem to drain life and warmth from those they encounter.

The disciples became convinced that they were in the presence of the Risen Lord Jesus Christ when he assumed a characteristic way of acting – sharing a companionable meal (of fish).

His bodily presence of that sort is now withdrawn from us. But we are now encountered by him in the Mass which has many dimensions, one of which is that of a sacred meal. When we share in the sacramental signs of his Real Presence in the Heavenly Bread and Spiritual Drink of Holy Communion, he brings us the life and warmth of the Risen Son.

In fact, he shares his very life with us, and because his life is gloriously fully human, we become less ghost-like as he heals those parts of our personality which drain goodness and vitality from the world.

We could take a moment to pray to take greater opportunities to share in the Real Presence of Our Risen Lord under the appearance of bread and wine. This will move us from the illusion of being alive to that vitality which is nourished by his glorified humanity.
