
Real Deal Community Forum March 14, 2024

22-year-old Ronita lives with her husband and two children in a Barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in Metro Manila in the Philippines. Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life-long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family.

Thankfully, Ronita was given a second chance at completing her studies when she heard about the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partners in the Philippines.

Through the FCJ's Alternative Learning System (ALS) program, Ronita was able to re-enroll in her studies, and continue learning in a safe and flexible environment – even with the arrival of her second child, Egzy Grey.


After completing her ALS classes, Ronita went on to earn her Grade 12 Senior High School Diploma. With her new diploma, Ronita has now secured a job at a call centre which she hopes will allow her to support her family while she continues her studies.

With the support of the FCJ, Ronita has overcome tremendous obstacles to enjoy better employment prospects and a brighter future for her whole family. '*I have now graduated senior school and I am so proud of myself,'* she said, '*I feel hopeful for the future ... Now it's not impossible for me to achieve my dream... Thank you.'*

In a social media era, make private time for God: Pope

Pope Francis opened the Lenten season with a procession and Mass on Ash Wednesday, telling Catholics to carve out a silent space for God amid the buzz of the digital era in which little remains private.

In his homily, the pope focused on the emphasis the day's scripture readings places on praying, fasting and giving alms '*in secret*,' saying Jesus's invitation to the disciples to '*go to your room'* to do these things instead of seeking public recognition for them is at the heart of the Lenten season.



Going to one's room, in this sense, he said, 'means journeying from without to within, so that our whole life, including our relationship with God, is not reduced to mere outward show, a frame without a picture, a draping of the soul, but is born from within and reflects the movements of our heart.'

'Without realizing it, we find ourselves no longer having an '*inner chamber'* in which we can stop and care for ourselves, immersed as we are in a world in which everything, including our emotions and deepest feelings, has to become '*social'*,' he said.

In the social media era, 'Even the most tragic and painful experiences risk not having a quiet place where they can be kept. Everything has to be exposed, shown off, fed to the gossip mill of the moment,' he said.

However, Francis said God's invitation for Lent is to `Enter into the secret, return to the centre of yourself.'

`Precisely there, where so many fears, feelings of guilt and sin are lurking, precisely there the Lord has descended in order to heal and cleanse you,' he said. *Cathnews*

Catholics encouraged to reflect on implications of damning report



The Productivity Commission last week released its report on the *Closing the Gap* agreement. In 2020, all Australian governments committed to 16 targets to tackle Aboriginal disadvantage by improving outcomes for First Nations peoples.

The latest report has found that improvement will continue to fail without fundamental changes, adding that successive governments have *`failed to fully grasp'* the challenges.

It calls for urgent changes to rescue the landmark Government of '*weak*' action on key areas, not fulfilling its

agreement, accusing the federal Government of '*weak'* action on key areas, not fulfilling its promises and a '*disregard'* for the suggestions of First Nations communities. It said that efforts to eliminate institutional racism in areas such as justice and health have '*received little effort'*..

In response to the report, Bishop Charles Gauci – chair of the Australian Catholic Bishops Commission for Relations with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders – emphasised the pressing need for Australian Catholics to collaborate with their First Nations counterparts to achieve tangible improvements in their lives.

'As a Church, we are called to illuminate and enrich Australian society, particularly in the realm of Indigenous affairs,' Bishop Gauci said. 'Now more than ever, we must unite, deliberate, and take meaningful action.'

He underscored the importance of Catholic institutions in fostering holistic wellbeing for all First Nations people.

`This moment urges us to contemplate how our Church entities can better support the health and prosperity of Indigenous communities,' Bishop Gauci said. He urged ongoing reflection and engagement, guided by the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, to ensure a more inclusive and supportive future for First Nations peoples.

Lent is a season of opportunity, a time to pause and discern the obstacles that block the path to greater intimacy with God and others. *What are the stones I keep tripping over, the distractions, superficial desires, attachments, what fears and wounds, like fallen trees, block the way ahead?*

May this Lent be a time of clearing the clutter of my life, opening the opportunity to intimacy, for in the words of Pope Francis, '**The life that Jesus gives us is a love story, a life** history that wants to blend with ours and sink roots in the soil of our own lives.'
