Reflection

We have now come to the end of the liturgical year, the point that marks the transition from one period to another. Today we see that the kingdom of God is inclusive. Its embrace is as comprehensive as is the embrace of God. Criteria for membership are not based on obedience to the commandments or on conformity to ritual obligation, but on the bonds of love and concern.

What we do for others, we do for Christ, because Christ is identified with those in need. We very seldom see the face of the glorified Christ in the

faces of the needy; it is more often the face of the disfigured Christ that is turned to us. We see his fear and his shame, his brokenness and sense of loss. As difficult as it may be to look into such eyes, it is precisely the needy with whom Christ is identified.

Having entered into the frailty of human nature, identified himself with the needy, and handed himself over to death, in the end Christ will have conquered all. It is a curious kingdom that he has won, a kingdom of the weak rather than the strong. He has turned the standards of the world upside down. He has shown that it does not take strength to ignore or to exploit the needy, but it does take strength to overcome our own selfishness in order to serve them. The kingdom that Christ hands over to God is a kingdom of love and care. Dianne Bergant CSA



St. Bernard's Parish - Laudato Si' Action Plan 2023-2024

Pope Francis released his encyclical letter *Laudato Si'* to call for action to address the spiritual, social and economic crisis causing environmental devastation. He called us to *'Hear the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor'*.



Taking their lead from Pope Francis, our Australian Catholic Bishops have invited us through Catholic Earthcare, to implement a *Laudato Si' Action Plan*, in order to be converted to new ways of living both personally and collectively, to care for our common home. The Pope's follow up Apostolic Exhortation *Laudate Deum* (Praise God) in October 2023 urges us to take dramatic action to combat climate change and condemns climate change denial in his writing.

St. Bernard's Parish has responded to this call by initiating a 2023-2024 Laudato Si Action Plan and we invite your contribution.

Pope says poverty a 'scandal' and urges Christians to use gifts for charity

The material, cultural and spiritual poverties that exist in the world are a 'scandal' that Christians are called to address by putting their God-given capacity for charity and love into action, Pope Francis said.



The poor, whether 'the oppressed, fatigued, marginalised, victims of war,' migrants, the hungry, those without work or left without hope, 'are not one, two, or three, they are a multitude,' the Pope said during a Mass celebrated for World Day of the Poor in St Peter's Basilica.

'And thinking of this immense multitude of the poor, the message of the Gospel is clear: let us not bury the wealth of the Lord. Let us spread charity, share our bread, multiply love,' he said. 'Poverty is a scandal.'

Among the 5000 who filled the basilica for Mass were homeless people and others in need who were seated in the front rows near Pope Francis. After celebrating Mass and praying the Angelus, the Pope ate lunch in the Vatican audience hall with about 1250 people, continuing a tradition he began on the first World Day of the Poor in 2017.


