

## We are only as strong as our weakest link: Bishop Long

It is in the interest of our health and our future to ensure that everyone's wellbeing is safeguarded," Parramatta Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv said ahead of the 2024 Catholic Social Services Conference in Melbourne next month.

"It is also in the interest of a better society and a better world that the human and social infrastructure of the "care economy" be prioritised more than profit and success."

Under the theme, "Commons, Commonality, Common Good", the February 21-23 event aims to bring together people of goodwill, particularly staff, leadership, volunteers in Catholic social services, health, education, parish communities, and individuals in faith and values-based organisations from across the country, and to inspire important conversations and positive action for the common good.

Bishop Long will open the conference, fostering thought and discussion on the topic, "What makes us human? What is essential to flourish?"

"I believe that what makes us human is the conviction that we are created in God's image. As such, flourishing in the most profound sense entails communion with God the Father through faith in Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit," Bishop Long said.

"At the conference, I'll be exploring Pope Francis' call to rebuild and revitalise the Church with a synodal vision rooted in unity in diversity, subsidiarity in solidarity and personal agency in communion that leads us to being a model society and an effective vehicle of the Good News for the disadvantaged, the planet and all of God's creation.

"Addressing inequity and caring for the poor and vulnerable are not optional extras. We are only as strong as our weakest links." Edited extract Cathnews

#### Reflection

As we know, in Jesus' society possession by 'unclean spirits' was a general term that covered all kinds of conditions for which we today have medical or social explanations and sophisticated labels. We can therefore approach these stories with a type of superiority as if they either don't occur anymore or are best left to experts to deal with.

Yet isn't it true that all of us are 'possessed' in different ways by forces over which we have to admit to having little or no control? Some people are enslaved by addictions to drugs, alcohol, food, gambling and so on. Many of us suffer from more subtle addictions so that we don't even want to admit to ourselves, let alone to anyone else, that we are virtually powerless to control them. All of us know deep down that many of our habits and ways of dealing with others are so much a part of our make-up that we can do little to change them.

The people who acclaimed Jesus realised that he had something special that could influence them to change their lives. The authority and healing power of Jesus is present today in his body, the Church, through the Sacraments, but also in the love, care and compassion of every community of faith.

We only have to look around us when we are gathered for the Eucharist to name it and accept it. It is when the Church is able to back up teaching and doctrine with the same concern for the troubled lives of ordinary people that it is most effective in continuing the mission of Jesus. That is why in the Gospels he is always accompanied by followers learning how to be genuine 'fishers of men'.

# **Francis announces Year of Prayer**

Pope Francis has announced the start of a Year of Prayer in preparation for the Catholic Church's 2025 Jubilee Year, whose theme is "Pilgrims of Hope"

The Pope said that a Year of Prayer starting 21st January will be "a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in one's personal life, in the life of the

Church, and in the world. I ask you to intensify your prayer to prepare us to live this event of grace well and to experience the power of God's hope."

The year 2024 also should be about rebuilding and renewing spiritual pathways and practices so that the spiritual significance of the Jubilee can "emerge more clearly, something which goes far beyond the necessary and urgent forms of structural organisation," said Archbishop Rino Fisichella, pro-prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelisation's section for new evangelisation, which is coordinating the Holy Year.

The jubilee must be "prepared for and lived in individual communities with that spirit of expectation which is typical of Christian hope," he said,

The Pope said that the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelisation will publish resources to help Catholic communities to more fully participate in the Year of Prayer.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church. It typically takes place once every 25 years, though the Pope can call for extraordinary jubilee years more often, such as in the case of the 2016 Year of Mercy or the 2013 Year of Faith.

The 2025 Jubilee Year begins on December 24 (Christmas Eve) and concludes on January 6, 2026.
